McKee confirmed that he sent a video to Bell that showed the initial moment that the group pulled up on Mensah's house. He denied filming it and said that it was sent to him. He did not know who actually filmed it and could only say that it was "somebody in the background".

**People's Revolution Security**

McKee acknowledged that he was armed with his personal handgun while at Mensah's residence. He justified it by saying that the People's Revolution has received threats from "clan's members" but acknowledged that he has never seen any of them in or around Wauwatosa. McKee offered that, "he likes armed individuals just in case something were to happen". I asked who 'he' was; McKee said, "Kahlil, he likes armed individuals". I asked him if the clan were to show up, would he just start shooting. He said, "No" and then said, "That's a touchy situation, it could go either way". I asked what they would do if an officer advised someone that they were under arrest; McKee said that, "they would have to deal with that arrest" and denied a willingness to use deadly force against the officer.

**People's Revolution's actions**

I offered that it appeared as though the People's Revolution conspired to murder Officer Mensah and his girlfriend. McKee did not respond. I then asked if it would be easy to paint that picture, he said "absolutely". I challenged him and said that, if it were that easy to paint that picture, then wouldn't Mensah have been justified in shooting them; McKee said, "Yeah". I then asked what they were doing McKee said, "You just made some valid points there". I asked why the People's Revolution members feel as though they have the right to protect themselves, to go over to his (Mensah's) home, intimidate and potentially murder Officer Mensah. That this occurred after they (the People's Revolution) had full knowledge that Mayor Dennis McBride, who has embraced the People's Revolution, put pressure on the Police and Fire Commission to suspend Mensah and take his gun away, thus leaving him with no ability to defend himself; McKee said, "his gun and badge".

I suggested that the People's Revolution went there that night to cause a
